AUDITORS' REPORT

We have audited the balance sheet of **CANADIAN ORGANIC GROWERS INC.** as at December 31, 2006, and the statements of receipts and disbursements and changes in net assets for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the organization's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, we have conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

In common with many charitable organizations, Canadian Organic Growers Inc. derives a significant portion of its revenue from sources, the completeness of which is not susceptible to audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the organization. Furthermore, a prior period adjustment was made and reported. Reference to the prior period adjustment is made in Note 1 of the notes to financial statements.

In our opinion the statement of receipts and disbursements presents fairly, in all material respects, the results of operations of the organization for the year ended December 31, 2006. Further, in our opinion, the balance sheet presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the organization as at December 31, 2006 in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

CANADIAN ORGANIC GROWERS INC.**SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES****For the year ended December 31, 2006****NATURE OF BUSINESS**

The corporation is dedicated to the establishment of a standard of organic agriculture, that is ecologically and economically sustainable and resulting in produce which enhances the life and health of Canadians.

The corporation was founded by Letters Patent, issued by the Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs, Canada, dated June 8, 1981. The corporation is a charitable organization.

These financial statements represent the operations of the national office of Canadian Organic Growers. They include some, but not all of the operations of the 15 regional COG chapters.

FAIR MARKET VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The organization's financial instruments consist of cash, amounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. Unless otherwise noted, it is managements' opinion that the organization is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from these financial instruments. The fair market value of the current financial instruments approximate their carrying value because of the relatively short period to maturity of the instruments.

INVENTORY

On an annual basis, Canadian Organic Growers adjusts its closing inventory figures to reflect the historical cost of actual inventory on hand. This adjustment is reported on financial statements after net income.

CAPITAL ASSETS

Capital assets are recorded at cost. Amortization is provided over the useful life of the assets using the straight-line basis as follows.

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from management's best estimates as additional information becomes available in the future.

REVENUE RECOGNITION

Donations and receipts for publications are recorded on an accrual basis.

The work of the organization is dependent on the voluntary service of many members. Since these services are not normally purchased by the organization and because of the difficulty in determining their fair value, donated services are not recognized in these statements.

ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES AND EFFECT ON OPERATIONAL SURPLUSES

Canadian Organic Growers is committed to renewing its governance framework and in doing so is making a number of changes that will improve organizational viability. Included in these changes are a focus on realistic budgeting and more timely financial information.

The amount \$28,200 of grant money from Agriculture and Agri-foods Canada for Terre en Devenir was included in the 2005 receipts. It should have been deferred income as it was carried forward and used in the current year.

The net effect of this change was a decrease in members' equity in 2005 and an equal increase in 2006.
